

Last year at the age of 36, Dr. Mordecai Brownlee became one of the youngest college presidents in the country and serves as an ambassador for the next generation of civic and community leaders. Dr. Mordecai is a dedicated educator and scholar who is emerging as a nationally sought-after speaker, advisor, and writer on matters regarding higher education, educational technology, equitable student success, and educational leadership. In addition, he proudly serves in many national and regional capacities including as a Board Member of the American Association of Community Colleges and Trust Member for Jobs for the Future. In 2020, Dr. Brownlee was featured by EdTech Magazine as one of the 30 most interesting voices in higher education.
